### International Workshop on German Experiences in dealing with Violent Pasts 26th June - 2nd July 2018, Berlin

The handling of violent past plays a central role in peace and reconciliation processes worldwide. Everyday business threatens to lose sight of the potential for healing and reconciliation and the challenges associated with them. As classic soft factors, which also have a pronounced cultural signature, they are still underestimated as a rule. This will not be without its effect on the long-term effectiveness of peace work. Nevertheless, the local churches in their respective contexts have accumulated many valuable experiences that are worth sharing. Against this background, the AGEH and the German Commission Justitia et Pax have been carrying out international workshops on this topic since 2009, with the respective bishops' conferences in Sierra Leone, Uganda, Burundi and Colombia, in order to make better use of these manifold experiences for the work of the Church and the respective ones To support partners. At the same time, these workshops have proved to be effective means of strengthening church reconciliation work and of the relevant cooperation between the Catholic agencies and the local churches.

As part of the workshop in Berlin, we will now treat, especially at the request of our partners, German key experiences dealing with violence burdened history. The workshop is intended to provide the German participants with a deeper understanding of their own background and to support the partners in sharpening their own perspectives in dealing with German experiences.

For this purpose, the participants will visit relevant places of remembrance and actors in order to explore the topic in its various dimensions in dealing with you. The deepening and the transfer into the respective contexts should be done by means of the OPEN-SPACE method. The common learning process should strengthen not only the inspiration of the participants, but also the relevant basis of understanding between the participants. In addition, the workshop is an important political signal of the church's involvement in this area.
